Financial Aid Information (Seniors)

- The new 2017-2018 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is now available at www.fafsa.ed.gov. To receive consideration for state or federal financial aid, individuals' 2017-2018 FAFSAs must be filed and received at the federal Central Processor by March 10, 2017 and corrected by May 15, 2017. A complete list of deadlines can be reviewed at www.in.gov/ssaci/2403.htm.
- The FSA ID – a username and password – has replaced the Federal Student Aid PIN and must be used to log in to certain U.S. Department of Education websites. Your FSA ID confirms your identity when you access your financial aid information and electronically sign Federal Student Aid documents. If you do not already have a FSA ID, you can create one when logging in to fafsa.gov.
- Please note the deadline for filing your FAFSA is a March 10th *receipt* deadline. This means your application *must be received by the Federal processor on or before March 10, 2017* in order to be considered for any state aid.
- Following the March 10th deadline, if your student has any edits or corrections to make to their FAFSA, these edits must be made by *May 15, 2017* in order to stay in the state grant pool.
- The Division of Student Financial Aid will no longer use paper edit letters or award letters to communicate with students. (You will not receive anything via the mail. It will be sent to the email you list on your FAFSA.) SFA will use emails to alert students of their eligibility or required edits. *It is the student's ultimate responsibility* to review their state grant file on eStudent

(www.ssaci.in.gov/estudent) to know if there is anything they need to do before SFA's correction deadline of *May 15th*.

- Sometimes colleges or universities require additional forms to apply for institutional aid. Students will want to check with their college or university for any institutional aid deadlines or additional required forms.
- Remember, filing a FAFSA is required in order to keep your scholarship if you are a 21st Century Scholar.
- Young men must register with the Selective Service in order to receive any type of federal aid. Register today at www.sss.gov.

University of Indianapolis Launches New Programs in Art Therapy and Mechanical Engineering (All grades)

Mechanical engineers are responsible for the creative design, development, research and testing of mechanical devices and systems from small tools to large engines and machines. Mechanical engineering is one of the broadest engineering disciplines and plays an important role in numerous industries including automotive, manufacturing, aerospace, energy, robotics and biotechnology.

The University of Evansville will launch a new logistics and supply chain management (LSCM) program in Fall 2018. There is a 6:1 demand-to-supply ratio for new college graduates in the supply chain field.

The LSCM program at UE will prepare students with the knowledge and skills desired by employers. In addition to a rigorous course of study, students will take part in high level experiential learning opportunities such as:

- Internships at large, global corporations
- Annual attendance at the Indiana Logistics Summit
- Participation in a mock Walmart warehouse program at the University of Arkansas
 - LSCM technology training through SAP University Alliance

The Schroeder School of Business will also create the center for logistics and supply chain management which will house experiential student programs and connect LSCM students to corporations.

Attention 7th & 8th Grade Students & Parents: (7th & 8th)

Your child may be eligible for a college scholarship. Indiana's 21st Century Scholars Program offers income-eligible Hoosier students up to four years of paid tuition at an eligible Indiana college or university after they graduate from high school. Scholars who enroll are connected to programs and resources to help them plan, prepare, and pay for college. 7th & 8th grade Indiana students whose families meet income eligibility guidelines must apply to become a 21st Century Scholar by June 30 of the student's 8th grade year.

Visit www.scholars.in.gov to learn more or to apply today. If you participate in the free/reduced lunch program, your child automatically meets the requirements for 21st Century Scholars, but you still have to apply.

- Students wishing to register with the NCAA Clearinghouse must list the NCAA eligibility center on their test registration as a school/institution to receive their test scores. NCAA eligibility center code is 9999. IU and Purdue also require test scores be sent directly from the testing agency.
- Eligible students can register with a fee waiver during the late period for any SAT test date. No late fee will apply. Note that deadlines for registering online are later than for paper registrations. See sat.org/register for appropriate deadlines.
